
Get a job? Doing what? Go to college or a trade school? Which one?

College is a big expense, but you don't have to break the bank on your way toward reaching your goals. If you think you can't afford college, there are a lot of resources to help make it more affordable. Options range from colleges themselves, to state and federal governments, to civic groups, foundations, businesses and community organizations. Today, more than half of those attending college in the U.S. receive some form of financial aid. Here's a sampling of funding sources:

If you and your family haven't started saving yet, nows the time to start. College savings can have tax advantages for your parents and, in Alaska, you can automatically save your Permanent Fund dividends by designating them to a college savings plan on the PFD application.

Both are money that doesn't have to be paid back. Grants generally are based on your and your parents' income, while scholarships are awarded to students meeting special requirements or demonstrating special talents such as outstanding academic performance in high school or athletic ability. University of Alaska Scholars Awards are available to the top 10 percent of graduating seniors from all qualified high schools in the state.


